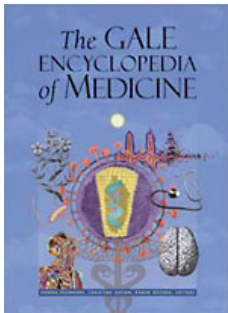

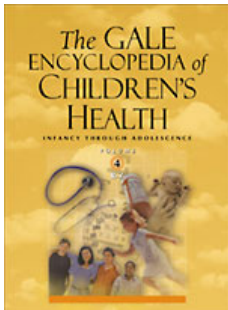
The Gale Encyclopedia of Medicine - eBook ISBN 9781414404851 – Thomson Gale
